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1 UVOD - METODOLOŠKA IN VSEBINSKA POJASNILA

V letnem poročilu o delu Državnega zbora prikazujemo aktivnosti poslank in poslacev na začetku šestega mandatnega obdobja, in sicer za obdobje od 21. 12. 2011 do 31. 12. 2012 (prvo leto mandatnega obdobja). Tako se poročilo o delu Državnega zbora nanaša predvsem na leto 2012, deloma pa tudi na 2011. Poročilo prikazuje bodisi:

- stanje na začetku mandata ob konstituiranju ali ob ustanovitvi oziroma začetku pojava,

Nekatere evidence podatkov, potrebne za pripravo poročila, vodimo sami. Pridobljene podatke smo statistično obdelali, uredili ter dodali grafične prikaze.

2 SPLOŠNI PODATKI

Leta 2011 je prvič v zgodovini samostojne Slovenije prišlo do predčasnih volitev (potekale so 4. 12. 2011) in s tem do nove sestave Državnega zbora. Konstitutivna seja Državnega zbora je bila 21. 12. 2011. V tabeli 2.1 prikazujemo sestavo Državnega zbora s spremembami.

Metodološko pojasnilo: Poslanci so navedeni po abecednem vrstnem redu. Zaporedna številka pred imenom in priimkom poslanca pomeni aktualno stanje na dan 31. 12. 2012, torej da poslanec na ta dan opravlja funkcijo. V tretjem stolpcu je podatek o članstvu v poslanski skupini. V četrtem stolpcu so navedene morebitne spremembe.

3 ZASEDANJA DRŽAVNEGA ZBORA

3.1 Seje Državnega zbora

Državni zbor je opravil 34 sej, in sicer 9 rednih in 25 izrednih sej.

Seje so bile odprte za javnost, z dvema izjemama:

- 4. redna seja je bila delno zaprta za javnost zaradi obravnave poročila o delu Komisije za nadzor obveščevalnih in varnostnih služb za leto 2011 (15. točka dnevnega reda dne 14. junija 2012),
- 16. izredna seja je bila delno zaprta za javnost zaradi obravnave poročila Banke Slovenije o stanju v slovenskem bančnem sistemu (26. točka dnevnega reda dne 17. julija 2012).

Vse seje skupaj so trajale 66 dni oziroma 343 ur in 9 minut. Redne seje so trajale 32 dni (ozioroma 166 ur in 36 minut), izredne seje pa 34 dni (ozioroma 176 ur in 33 minut).

Državni zbor je obravnaval 246 točk dnevnega reda. Na rednih sejah je obravnaval 146 točk, na izrednih sejah pa 100 točk dnevnega reda. Na sejah je bilo opravljenih 5998 nastopov, od tega so poslanci nastopili 3492-krat, predstavniki Vlade pa 967-krat.


3.2 Prekinitve sej in obstrukcije

Seje so bile iz različnih razlogov prekinjene 101-krat, poslanske skupine so napovedale 30 obstrukcij. Razlogi za prekinitve so podrobneje prikazani v tabeli 3.2. Med najbolj pogostimi razlogi je prekinitev pred glasovanjem ali zaradi glasovanja, prekinitev na zahtevo poslanskih skupin, prekinitev zaradi pridobitve mnenja (delovnih teles, vlade, ZPS) ter kategorija »drugo«, v katero sodijo predvsem prekinitve zaradi tajnih glasovanj.

3.3 Predlagani in sprejeti zakoni ter drugi akti

V tabelah so v nadaljevanju prikazani vsi zakoni in drugi akti, ki jih je Državni zbor sprejel do konca leta 2012. Med akti so posebej prikazane vsebinske kategorije nacionalni programi, parlamentarne preiskave, referendumi in poročila. Predstavljeno pa je tudi število predlaganih in sprejetih zakonov glede na predlagatelja in število sprejetih zakonov glede na vrsto zakonodajnega postopka.

V tem obdobju je bilo sprejetih 141 zakonov. Največ je bilo sprejetih zakonov o spremembah in dopolnitvah (90), zakonov, ki so na novo urejali določeno problematiko, pa 15. Z zakonom je bilo ratificiranih 35 mednarodnih pogodb, sprejet pa je bil tudi en akt o notifikaciji nasledstva. Državni zbor je v tem obdobju sprejel 122 drugih aktov.

Na koncu so prikazane še nekatere posebnosti pri obravnavi v rednem postopku: zahteve za splošno razpravo in pa podatki o tem, kolikokrat sta bili druga in tretja obravnava zakona opravljeni na isti seji.

3.3.4 Posebnosti pri obravnavi po rednem zakonodajnem postopku

V letu 2012 je bilo 19 zakonov sprejetih po rednem zakonodajnem postopku. Od teh jih je 17 predlagala vlada, 2 pa so predlagali poslanci.

Zahteve za splošno razpravo

Po Poslovniku lahko najmanj 10 poslancev zahteva splošno razpravo v prvi obravnavi predloga zakona po rednem postopku. V letu 2012 je bilo sprejetih 8 zakonov, v zvezi s katerimi je bila opravljena splošna razprava. Enega izmed njih je predlagala skupina poslancev, ostale pa vlada.

Pobudniki splošne razprave o zakonih, ki jih je predlagala Vlada, so bili kot prvpodpisani poslanci iz naslednjih poslanskih skupin: SD (5x), PS (1x) in SDS (1x). Kot sopodpisniki zahteve so nastopili poslanci iz naslednjih poslanskih skupin: DL, SLS, NSi in DeSUS (vsi po 1x). Na zakon, ki ga je vložila skupina poslancev s prvpodpisanim poslancem iz SD, je zahtevo za splošno razpravo vložila ista poslanska skupina. Tabelično so podatki o zahtevah za splošno razpravo po poslanskih skupinah prikazani v 6. poglavju.

Prehod na tretjo obravnavo in glasovanje o zakonu

Če so v drugi obravnavi sprejeti amandmaji k manj kot desetini členov dopolnjenega predloga zakona, lahko Državni zbor na predlog predlagatelja sklene, da bo na isti seji opravil tretjo obravnavo predloga zakona (138. člen Poslovnika). V letu 2012 so bili po tem postopku sprejeti 4 zakoni oziroma 21,1 % vseh zakonov, sprejetih po rednem postopku.

Če v drugi obravnavi k dopolnjenemu predlogu zakona ni sprejet noben amandma, Državni zbor na isti seji glasuje o zakonu (139. člen Poslovnika). V tem letu so poslanci po tem členu Poslovnika sprejeli 13 zakonov ali 68,4 % vseh zakonov, sprejetih po rednem postopku.

To pomeni, da sta bili druga in tretja obravnavi zakona opravljeni na isti seji v 89,5 % primerov (17 zakonov) sprejemanja zakona po rednem postopku.

3.4 Amandmaji

V preučevanem obdobju je bilo vloženih skupno 2268 amandmajev, sprejetih pa 1564 amandmajev. Od tega je bilo k zakonom vloženo 2106 amandmajev in sprejetih 1496 amandmajev. Glede na to, da je bilo sprejetih 141 zakonov, je bilo na posamezni sprejeti zakon vloženo povprečno 14,94 amandmajev in sprejeto 10,61 amandmajev.

Aprila 2012 je Zoran Petrovič s Polzele vložil pobudo volivcem za vložitev zahteve za razpis **zakonodajnega referendumu** o Zakonu o spremembah Zakona o dodatnih interventnih ukrepih za leto 2012 (EPA 244-VI). Ker je bilo zbranih premalo podpisov, referendum ni bil razpisani.

Isti pobudnik je maja vložil pobudo volivcem za vložitev zahteve za razpis **zakonodajnega referendumu** o Zakonu za uravnoteženje javnih financ (EPA 263-VI). Ker je pobudnik naknadno umaknil pobudo, je bil postopek zbiranja podpisov ustavljen.

Julija je Viljem Kovačič iz Ljubljane vložil pobudo volivcem za vložitev zahteve za razpis **zakonodajnega referendumu** o Zakonu o poroštvi Republike Slovenije za obveznosti iz dolgoročnega posojila v višini 440 milijonov evrov, ki ga najame Termoelektrarna Šoštanj d.o.o. pri Evropski investicijski banki, za financiranje projekta postavitve nadomestnega bloka 6 moči 600

MW v Termoelektrarni Šoštanj (EPA 112-VI). Pobuda ni bila podprta z zadostnim številom podpisov, zato ni bil določen rok za zbiranje podpisov.

Oktobra je Sindikat delavcev v dejavnosti energetike Slovenije vložil pobudo volivcem za vložitev zahteve za razpis **zakonodajnega referendumu** o Zakonu o Slovenskem državnem holdingu (EPA 516-VI). Pobudnik je pobudo naknadno umaknil, zato ni bil določen rok za zbiranje podpisov.

Oktobra je Sindikat KNG - kemične, nekovinske in gumarske industrije Slovenije - vložil pobudo volivcem za razpis **zakonodajnega referendumu** o Zakonu o ukrepih Republike Slovenije za krepitev stabilnosti bank (EPA 637-VI). Pobudo je po naknadnem preverjanju podprlo zadostno število volilnih upravičencev, zato je bil razpisani rok za zbiranje podpisov. Zbiranje podpisov je bilo zadržano zaradi zahteve Državnega zbora za presojo protiustavnih posledic. Ustavno sodišče je 17. 12. 2012 odločilo, da bi z odložitvijo uveljavitve in z zavrnitvijo zakona lahko nastale protiustavne posledice. Referendum zato ni bil razpisan.

Oktobra je skupina poslank in poslancev s pravopodpisanim Janijem Möderndorferjem vložila zahtevo za razpis **zakonodajnega referendumu** o Zakonu o Slovenskem državnem holdingu (EPA 516-VI). Na predlog Državnega zbora je Ustavno sodišče 17. 12. 2012 odločilo, da bi z odložitvijo uveljavitve in z zavrnitvijo zakona na referendumu lahko nastale protiustavne posledice, zato referendum ni bil razpisan.

Oktobra je skupina poslank in poslancev s pravopodpisanim Janijem Möderndorferjem vložila zahtevo za razpis **zakonodajnega referendumu** o Zakonu o ukrepih Republike Slovenije za krepitev stabilnosti bank (EPA 637-VI). Ker zahteva ni izpolnjevala vseh zakonskih pogojev (prištevane so bile le kopije podpisov), referendum ni bil razpisan.

Novembra je Dušan Harlander iz Novega mesta vložil pobudo volivcem za razpis **zakonodajnega referendumu** o Zakonu o spremembah in dopolnitvah Zakona o zdravstveni dejavnosti (EPA 598-VI). Pobuda je bila podprta z zadostnim številom podpisom, zato je predsednik Državnega zbora razpisal rok za zbiranje podpisov volivk in volivcev, ki je potekel 6. 2. 2013. Ker ni bilo zbranih dovolj podpisov, referendum ni bil razpisan.

Decembra je Sindikat poklicnega gasilstva Slovenije vložil pobudo volivcem za razpis **zakonodajnega referendumu** o Zakonu o izvrševanju proračunov Republike Slovenije za leti 2013 in 2014 (EPA 694-VI). Določen je bil rok za zbiranje podpisov volivk in volivcev, med katerim je Državni zbor sprejel sklep za presojo ustavnosti posledic, ki bi nastale z odložitvijo uveljavitve ali zaradi zavrnitve zakona. Istega dne je pobudnik umaknil pobudo, zato je bil postopek zbiranja podpisov ustavljen.

Ljudska iniciativa

Maja je YHD - Društvo za teorijo in kulturo hendikepa dalo pobudo volivcem za vložitev Predloga zakona o osebni asistenci. Zbranih je bilo dovolj podpisov in 15. 6. 2012 se je začel zakonodajni postopek (EPA 434-VI), a zakon ni bil sprejet.

Novembra je Študentska organizacija Slovenije vložila Predlog zakona o štipendiranju (EPA 781-VI), ki je bil na dan 31. 12. 2012 še v zakonodajnem postopku.

V letu 2012 je Združenje umetnikov Paviljon iz Komna dalo pobudo volivcem za vložitev 4 predlogov zakonov (Predlog zakona o referendumu in ljudski iniciativi, Predlog zakona o osnovnem bivanju, Predlog zakona o samozdravljenju in Predlog zakona o konoplji), ki pa v določenem roku niso dobili zadostne podpore, zato se zakonodajni postopek ni začel.

V obdobju od 21. 12. 2011 do 31. 12. 2012 Državnemu zboru ni bila podana nobena zahteva za glasovanje o **zaupnici** oz. **nezaupnici** **Vladi**. V prvem letu mandata 2011-2015 ni **odstopil** noben minister, tudi Državni zbor ni **razrešil** nobenega ministra.

3.8 Odločanje o imuniteti

Ustava Republike Slovenije določa, da poslanec Državnega zbora ni kazensko odgovoren za mnenje ali glas, ki ga je izrekel na sejah Državnega zbora ali njegovih delovnih telesih (poklicna imuniteta). Prav tako ne sme biti priprt, niti se zoper njega, če se sklicuje na imuniteto, ne sme začeti kazenskega postopka brez dovoljenja Državnega zbora, razen v primeru, če je bil zaloten pri kaznivem dejanju, za katerega je predpisana kazen zapora nad pet let (nepoklicna imuniteta). Državni zbor lahko prizna poslancu imuniteto tudi v primeru, da se nanjo ne sklicuje ali če je bil zaloten pri kaznivem dejanju (83. člen ustave).

Ustava Republike Slovenije zagotavlja imuniteto tudi sodnikom in sodnikom Ustavnega sodišča. Na podlagi Zakona o varahu človekovih pravic uživajo imuniteto tudi Varuh človekovih pravic in njegovi namestniki.

V obdobju od 1. 1. do 31. 12. 2012 je Mandatno-volilna komisija obravnavala 11 zadev v zvezi z imuniteto poslancev. Poslancem imuniteta ni bila priznana in se nanjo tudi niso sklicevali.

V istem obdobju je Državni zbor obravnaval 2 primera v zvezi z imuniteto sodnikov. V enem primeru je bila imuniteta priznana.

4 AKTIVNOSTI DRŽAVNEGA ZBORA NA PODROČJU ZADEV EU

Na podlagi 3.a člena Ustave, Zakona o sodelovanju med Državnim zborom in Vlado v zadevah Evropske unije ter določil Poslovnika Državnega zbor sooblikuje in sprejema stališča Republike Slovenije o posameznih zakonodajnih predlogih, ki jih obravnavajo institucije EU, in sicer na tistih področjih, ki bi po vsebini sodila v pristojnost Državnega zборa, če Slovenija ne bi prenesla izvrševanja dela svoje suverenosti na institucije EU. Državni zbor lahko na predlog Vlade ali na lastno pobudo obravnava tudi druge zadeve EU oziroma se seznanja z gradivi s tega področja. Najmanj enkrat letno razpravlja o stanju v EU in položaju Republike Slovenije v njej na podlagi uvodne predstavitev predsednika Vlade. Državni zbor tudi sprejme stališča o političnih usmeritvah za delovanje Republike Slovenije v institucijah Evropske unije v prihodnjem obdobju. Kadar Državni zbor ugotovi kršitev načela subsidiarnosti z zakonodajnim aktom institucij EU, posreduje državnemu pravobranilstvu sklep z obrazložitvijo, v kateri so navedene kršitve, nalog za vložitev tožbe in usmeritvena navodila za zastopanje.

V nadaljevanju so prikazani podatki o aktivnostih Državnega zborja v plenarni zasedbi, o obravnavanju zadev EU na sejah pristojnih in matičnih delovnih teles ter o postopkih nadzora nad upoštevanjem načela subsidiarnosti v obdobju od 21. 12. 2011 do 31. 12. 2012.

4.1 Odločanje o zadevah EU na plenarnih sejah Državnega zbora

V obdobju od 21. 12 2011 do 31. 12 2012 Državni zbor v plenarni zasedbi ni obravnaval zadev EU.

4.2 Obravnavanje zadev EU na sejah delovnih teles

Podatke o številu sej obeh pristojnih odborov za zadeve EU v obdobju od 21. 12. 2011 do konca leta 2012 in o tem, na koliko sejah so bile obravnavane zadeve EU, prikazujemo v tabeli št. 4.1, strukturo obravnavanih zadev pa v tabeli št. 4.2. V tabeli 4.3 so prikazani podatki o strukturi obravnavanih zadev na sejah matičnih delovnih teles na področju zadev EU. V vseh tabelah smo kot obravnavane zadeve zaradi metodoloških razlogov šteli tudi "S" zadeve EU (glej v nadaljevanju), s katerimi se delovna telesa samo seznanjajo. 4.3 Nadzor nad upoštevanjem načela subsidiarnosti

V obdobju med 21. 12. 2011 in 31. 12. 2012 je bil izveden en postopek nadzora nad upoštevanjem načela subsidiarnosti, in sicer v zvezi s Predlogom direktive Evropskega parlamenta in Sveta o kolektivnem upravljanju avtorskih in sorodnih pravic ter izdajanju večozemeljskih licenc za pravice za glasbena dela za spletno uporabo na notranjem trgu, COM(2012) 372 final, EPA 664-VI, EU SUBS 1. V navedenem postopku, ki ga v zgornjih tabelah nismo posebej prikazali, sta sodelovala Odbor za zadeve EU in Odbor za gospodarstvo.

5 DELOVNA TELESA IN PREISKOVALNE KOMISIJE

5.1 Splošni podatki o delovnih telesih

V obdobju od 21. 12. 2011 do 31. 12. 2012 je v Državnem zboru Republike Slovenije skupaj delovalo osem komisij in štirinajst odborov, ob koncu leta pa je delovalo samo še dvanajst odborov, saj sta Skupni odbor in Odbor za notranjo politiko, javno upravo in pravosodje z dnem 27. 1. 2012 prenehala delovati. Skupaj je torej ob koncu leta 2012 delovalo 20 delovnih teles.

Sestava delovnih teles odraža sestavo Državnega zbora kot celote. V posameznih primerih obstajajo tudi določena odstopanja, kot npr. pri obeh nadzornih komisijah in Komisiji za narodni skupnosti, v katerih poslanci koalicije ob koncu leta 2012 niso imeli večine. Ravno tako obstaja v posameznih delovnih telesih specifičen način dela, zaradi česar jih ni mogoče enostavno primerjati z drugimi.

Glede na skupno število popolnjenih mest (281) v vseh delovnih telesih so bile posamezne poslanske skupine na dan 31. 12. 2012 dejansko zastopane takole:

- PS PS - 88 mest (31,3 %),
- PS SDS - 82 mest (29,2 %),
- PS SD - 29 mest (10,3 %),
- PS DL - 22 mest (7,8 %),
- PS SLS - 19 mest (6,8 %),
- PS DeSUS - 17 mest (6,0 %),
- PS NSi - 16 mest (5,7 %),
- PS italijanske in madžarske narodne skupnosti - 8 mest (2,8 %).

Nepovezani poslanci (NeP) na dan 31. 12. 2012 niso bili zastopani v delovnih telesih.




Graf št. 5.3: Število točk na dnevнем redu sej delovnih teles v obdobju od 21. 12. 2011 do 31. 12. 2012



5.4 Preiskovalne komisije

Graf št. : Skupna aktivnost poslancev po PS na rednih in izrednih sejah



Graf 6.: Zahteve po prekinitvi sej po poslanskih skupinah v %







11.2 Ukrepi za znižanje porabe

V Državnem zboru so se tako kot že v prejšnjem mandatnem obdobju varčevalni ukrepi nadaljevali tudi v tem mandatnem obdobju. V letu 2011 je bila realizacija proračuna na materialnih stroških in drugih odhodkih 77 % glede na veljavni proračun, v letu 2012 pa 70 %. Na področju investicij in vzdrževanja je bila v letu v letu 2011 realizacija 83 % glede na veljavni proračun; v letu 2012 pa 79 %. Celotna realizacija proračuna Državnega zbora je bila v letu 2011 93 % glede na veljavni proračun, v letu 2012 pa 91%.

Poraba v letu 2012 je bila na materialnih stroških in drugih odhodkih manjša za približno 550.000 evrov glede na porabo v letu 2011 zaradi sprejetih varčevalnih ukrepov, največ na področju pisarniškega materiala, tekočem vzdrževanju in izdatkih za službena potovanja.

Podrobneje je varčevanje, ki je evidentirano na proračunski postavki 3325 *Materialni stroški*, po nekaterih kategorijah materialnih stroškov za leto 2012 v primerjavi s povprečjem 2008 - 2011 prikazano v Tabeli 11.3.

Nadaljnje zmanjševanje materialnih stroškov je po oceni vodstva zelo oteženo, še zlasti zaradi splošnih podražitev, saj so se v zadnjih letih povečali stroški goriv in ogrevanja, poštnih in komunalnih storitev.

12 DRŽAVNI ZBOR V PRVEM LETU ŠESTEGA MANDATA - NEKAJ UGOTOVITEV GENERALNE SEKRETARKE DRŽAVNEGA ZBORA

Po prvih predčasnih volitvah v sicer kratki zgodovini samostojne slovenske države, ki so bile 4. decembra 2011, so se novoizvoljeni poslanci in poslanke na konstitutivni seji sestali 21. decembra 2011. Potrdili so mandate poslank in poslancev, nato pa prešli na glasovanje o predsedniku Državnega zbora. Po predhodnih dogоворih o koaliciji, ki jih je javnost poznala iz medijev, je bilo pričakovati, da bo za predsednika Državnega zbora izvoljen kandidat Socialnih demokratov, vendar se je na seji pojavila tudi kandidatura poslanke Pozitivne Slovenije. Ker v dveh glasovanjih noben od predlogov ni prejel zahtevane večine, je bila tik pred tretjim glasovanjem vložena kandidatura predsednika Državljske liste dr. Gregorja Viranta, s čimer se je nakazovala koalicija, ki je z 52 glasovi izvolila dr. Gregorja Viranta za predsednika.

Na konstitutivni seji je nato Državni zbor za podpredsednika Državnega zbora izvolil Jakoba Presečnika iz SLS ter Ljudmilo Novak iz NSi. Na tretje podpredsedniško mesto, ki po poslovniku pripada največji opozicijski poslanski skupini, je bila 2. 2. 2012 izvoljena Renata Brunskole, poslanka Pozitivne Slovenije.

Na dan konstituiranja in v naslednjih dneh so bile ustanovljene vse poslanske skupine – skupaj osem: sedem na podlagi list političnih strank, ki so sodelovale na volitvah, eno poslansko skupino pa v vsakokratni sestavi Državnega zbora predstavljata poslanca italijanske in madžarske narodne skupnosti.

Na prvi seji Državnega zbora je bil sprejet Odlok o ustanovitvi in nalogah delovnih teles Državnega zbora (v nadaljevanju odlok), s katerim so bili ustanovljeni: Odbor za zadeve Evropske unije, Odbor za finance in monetarno politiko, Odbor za notranjo politiko, javno upravo in pravosodje in Skupni odbor. Z ustanovitvijo delovnih teles je lahko Državni zbor začel zakonodajno dejavnost in se še v letu 2011 sestal na izredni seji ter sprejel zakon o nujnih interventnih ukrepih.

Konec januarja 2012 je bil sprejet novi odlok, s katerim je Državni zbor v celoti določil svoja delovna telesa in njihove pristojnosti.

V januarju 2012 je bilo v Državnem zboru intenzivno politično dogajanje. Na 2. izredni seji je Državni zbor glasoval o mandatarju za sestavo vlade, ki ga je predlagal predsednik republike, in sicer je bil predlagan predsednik Pozitivne Slovenije Zoran Janković, ki pa ni zbral potrebne večine glasov. S tem se je pokazalo, da se je dejansko oblikovala desnosredinska koalicija na čelu s SDS. Ta koalicija je 28. 1. 2012 na 5. izredni seji Državnega zbora tudi imenovala predsednika SDS Janeza Janšo za predsednika vlade. Na podlagi spremenjenega zakona o vladni, s katerim se je število ministrstev zmanjšalo, je Državni zbor v začetku februarja imenoval tudi ministre, s čimer se je zaključil proces oblikovanja Vlade Republike Slovenije. Število ministrov je bilo zmanjšano na 12 – med njimi je 11 ministrov prevzelo vodenje ministrstev, ministrica brez listnice pa vodenje Urada za Slovence v zamejstvu in po svetu.

Z izvolitvijo tretje podpredsednice (v začetku februarja) in imenovanjem generalne sekretarke (sredi februarja) je bil proces konstituiranja Državnega zbora šestega mandata končan.

Značilnost sestave šestega mandata je relativno veliko novih poslank in poslancev ter do sedaj najvišje število poslank. V sestavi Državnega zbora šestega mandata je bilo ob njegovem konstituiranju kar 54 novih poslank in poslancev – ponovno izvoljenih je bilo le 40 % poslank in poslancev. V njegovi sestavi je bilo tudi 29 poslank (32 %), kar je največ v vseh dosedanjih mandatih. Zaradi odhoda nekaterih poslancev in poslank na funkcije v vladi in na ministrstvih oz. na druge funkcije, ki so nezdružljive z opravljanjem funkcije poslanca, ali iz drugih razlogov, je sledilo nekaj sprememb. Število poslank se je celo povečalo, tako da je bilo ob koncu leta 2012 v

Državnem zboru 34 poslank, zmanjšal pa se je delež ponovno izvoljenih na 30 poslank in poslancev.

Zaradi gospodarske krize, ki se je odražala tudi v Republiki Sloveniji, so bili v Državnem zboru že v mandatu 2008–2011 sprejeti številni varčevalni ukrepi, ki so se v največji meri pokazali v zmanjšani porabi pri materialnih stroških in investicijah Državnega zbora. Tako na začetku mandata 2011–2015 pa so na pobudo predsednika Državnega zbora stekle še nadaljnje aktivnosti za varčevanje na vseh področjih in ne le pri materialnih stroških. Tako je Državni zbor s spremembou zakona o poslancih skrajšal čas prejemanja in višino nadomestila plače poslancem, ki jim je prenehal mandat. Po novem jim pripada nadomestilo v višini 80 % zadnje plače, vendar najdlje 6 mesecev od prenehanja mandata. Čas prejemanja nadomestila se lahko podaljša še največ za 6 mesecev, če v tem času poslanec izpolni pogoje za upokojitev oz. če je opravljal funkcijo poslanca že pred mandatom, ki mu je prenehal. Pravice do nadomestila pa nima poslanec, ki mu je funkcija poslanca prenehala pred potekom šestih mesecev od potrditve mandata.

Poslanci so s spremembou internih aktov zmanjšali tudi znesek, ki ga imajo na voljo za uporabo mobilnih telefonov in službenih prenosnih računalnikov, obseg sredstev za pokrivanje materialnih stroškov pri opravljanju funkcije v zvezi z delom v volilni enoti, (tako imenovani poslanski pavšal) in višino zneska za pokrivanje stroškov delovanja poslanskih pisarn. Zmanjšan je tudi obseg sredstev za izobraževanje poslancev – ta sredstva so strogo namenska in se lahko uporabijo le za funkcionalno izobraževanje ter za nakup učbenikov, strokovne literature in drugih avdio-video izobraževalnih pripomočkov. Knjige, kupljene iz sredstev za izobraževanje poslancev, so evidentirane kot knjižnično gradivo in jih morajo poslanci po koncu mandata vrniti v knjižnico Državnega zbora.

Poslanske skupine so porabile tudi manj sredstev za strokovno pomoč poslancem – realizacija v letu 2012 je glede na razpoložljiva sredstva nižja za 30 %.

Z Zakonom o uravnoteženju javnih financ so se zmanjšale plače tudi poslancem, zmanjšal se je znesek nadomestila za ločeno življenje, znesek regresa za prehrano, povračilo stroškov prevoza na delo in z dela. Enako velja tudi za vse zaposlene v Državnem zboru. Vodstvo Državnega zbora je ves čas zelo dosledno sledilo logiki varčevanja na vseh področjih. Restriktivno politiko je vodilo tudi pri plačilu nadur in povečanega obsega dela, zaposlovanja ni bilo niti za nadomeščanje daljših bolniških odsotnostih in upokojitev, medtem ko je bilo študentsko delo odobreno le izjemoma.

Državni zbor je v letu 2012 še naprej varčeval tudi pri potovanjih poslancev v tujino. Stroški službenih potovanj so v letu 2012 manjši kar za polovico glede na 2011 oz. prejšnja leta; največ na račun varčevalnih ukrepov in tudi konstruiranja mandata v prvih mesecih leta 2012.

V letu 2012 so bili zmanjšani tudi stroški za reprezentanco.

Državni zbor je torej v letu 2012 proračunska sredstva porabljal zelo racionalno, s čimer je ustvaril precejšnje prihranke. Še nadaljnje zmanjševanje porabe pa je po oceni vodstva zelo oteženo, saj so se v zadnjih letih precej povečale cene nekaterih storitev in tudi blaga, na kar Državni zbor nima vpliva.

Prvo leto mandata 2011–2015 so pretresala številna medijsko odmevna vprašanja, ki so odpirala dvome o osebni integriteti in o primernosti nekaterih poslancev, da opravljajo poslanske funkcije. Pred koncem leta 2012 je zaradi pravnomočne obsodbe ena poslanka odstopila, en poslanec pa svoj odstop napovedal in ga realiziral v začetku februarja 2013. Trije poslanci so izstopili iz svojih poslanskih skupin in delujejo kot nepovezani poslanci. Ta dogajanja so sprožila razprave o potrebi po večji osebni integriteti izvoljenih predstavnikov, močne odzive javnosti ter padec zaupanja v Državni zbor.

Slabšanje gospodarskih in socialnih razmer v družbi, krčenje obsega javnih storitev in napovedi nadaljnjega varčevanja, zmanjševanja plač in obsega zaposlenih v javnem sektorju, povečanje nezaposlenosti v realnem sektorju, napovedani ukrepi za sanacijo bančnega sistema, nekatere sprejete določbe v zakonu o ustanovitvi družbe za upravljanje z državnim premoženjem ter kasnejša prepoved referendumu s strani Ustavnega sodišča, poročila Komisije za preprečevanje korupcije o korupciji in klientelizmu v občinah ter na državnem nivoju; vse to je bilo povod za val nezadovoljstva v družbi, ki je pripeljalo do spontanih demonstracij že v oktobru, nato še novembra in decembra ter se nadaljuje tudi v letu 2013. Državljeni so zahtevali, da aktivo sodelujejo pri oblikovanju in sprejemanju odločitev, kar je vodilo tudi v zahtevo po odstopu aktualne politične elite. Ti dogodki in zahteve nezadovoljnih državljenov so se odrazili tudi pri delu Državnega zbora, ki je kljub temu opravil izjemno velik obseg dela.

* * *

Državni zbor je torej v prvem letu šestega mandata:

- zasedal na 34 sejah – na 9 rednih in 25 izrednih, v skupnem trajanju 66 dni oziroma 343 ur in 9 minut;
- obravnaval 246 točk dnevnega reda – na rednih sejah 146 točk, na izrednih sejah pa 100 točk.

Seje Državnega zbora so bile odprte za javnost, razen dveh, za javnost delno zaprtih sej:

- 15. točke dnevnega reda 4. redne seje 11. 6. 2012 (obravnavava poročila o delu Komisije za nadzor obveščevalnih in varnostnih služb za leto 2011);
- 26. točke dnevnega reda 16. izredne seje 20. 7. 2012 (obravnavava poročila Banke Slovenije o stanju v slovenskem bančnem sistemu).

Postopkovne podrobnosti sej Državnega zbora: 101 prekinitev sej, od tega 54 na rednih in 47 na izrednih sejah, napovedanih in izvedenih je bilo 30 obstrukcij, od tega 4 na rednih in 26 na izrednih sejah.

V tem obdobju je bilo sprejetih 141 zakonov. Največ je bilo sprejetih zakonov o spremembah in dopolnitvah (90); zakonov, ki so na novo urejali določeno problematiko, pa 15. Z zakonom je bilo ratificiranih 35 mednarodnih pogodb, sprejet pa je bil tudi en akt o notifikaciji nasledstva. Državni zbor je v tem obdobju sprejel 122 drugih aktov.

V letu 2012 je bilo po rednem zakonodajnem postopku sprejetih 19 zakonov. Od teh jih je 17 predlagala vlada, 2 pa so predlagali poslanci.

V obravnavanem obdobju je bilo vloženih 658 poslanskih vprašanj in pobud. Na vsa vprašanja in pobude so poslanci tudi prejeli odgovore.

Ustanovljena ni bila nobena preiskovalna komisija.

Na podlagi Zakona o referendumu in ljudski iniciativi je bilo vloženo 9 pobud oz. zahtev za zakonodajni referendum, a do razpisa teh referendumov ni prišlo (v dveh primerih je Ustavno sodišče odločilo, da bi z odložitvijo uveljavitev in z zavrnitvijo zakonov na referendumu lahko nastale protiustavne posledice, zato referendum ni bil razpisan). Je pa bil na podlagi zbranih podpisov volivcev iz leta 2011 izведен referendum o Družinskem zakoniku. Podano je bilo tudi 6 pobud volivcem za vložitev predloga zakona. Za dva zakona je bilo zbranih dovolj podpisov in sta bila vložena v zakonodajni postopek (Predlog zakona o osebni asistenci ni bil sprejet, zakonodajni postopek za Predlog zakona o štipendiranju pa do konca leta 2012 še ni bil končan).

Državni zbor je v novembru razpravljal o interpelaciji o delu in odgovornosti ministra za notranje zadeve dr. Vinka Gorenaka, ki jo je vložila skupina poslank in poslancev (prvopodpisani Jani Möderndorfer), a interpelacije ni izglasoval.

Mandatno-volilna komisija je obravnavala 11 zadev, ki so se nanašale na imuniteto poslancev. Poslancem imuniteta ni bila priznana in se nanjo tudi niso sklicevali. V istem obdobju je Državni zbor obravnaval 2 primera v zvezi z imuniteto sodnikov. V enem primeru je bila imuniteta priznana.

V obravnavanem obdobju Državni zbor v plenarni zasedbi o zadevah EU ni odločal. Odbor za zadeve EU in Odbor za zunanjou politiku kot pristojni delovni telesi sta zadeve EU obravnavala na 66 sejah (OZEU na 55 in OZP na 11 sejah), matična delovna telesa – odbori pa na 78 sejah. Izveden je bil en postopek nadzora nad upoštevanjem načela subsidiarnosti, in sicer v zvezi s Predlogom direktive Evropskega parlamenta in Sveta o kolektivnem upravljanju avtorskih in sorodnih pravic ter izdajanju večozemeljskih licenc za pravice za glasbena dela za spletno uporabo na notranjem trgu.

V Državnem zboru Republike Slovenije je od konstituiranja skupaj delovalo 8 komisij in 14 odborov, ob koncu leta 2012 pa samo še 12 odborov, saj sta Skupni odbor in Odbor za notranjo politiko javno upravo in pravosodje konec januarja 2011 prenehala delovati.

Delovna telesa so se sestala na 436 sejah, od tega je bilo 58 % nujnih sej. Seje so trajale 890 ur in 46 minut. Obravnavala so 1141 točk dnevnega reda. Izvedla so tudi 4 javne predstavitve mnenj.

Kolegij predsednika Državnega zbora se je sestal na 38 sejah in obravnaval zadeve iz svoje pristojnosti. Na začetku mandata je skladno s številom poslancev posameznih poslanskih skupin tudi določil, kateri poslanski skupini pripada mesto predsednika, podpredsednika in koliko mest ima posamezna poslanska skupina v delovnih telesih in stalnih delegacijah.

Bogata je bila mednarodna dejavnost Državnega zbora in njegovih delovnih teles. Državni zbor ima svoje delegacije v 7 mednarodnih parlamentarnih institucijah, v katerih so člani delegacij iz Državnega zbora v letu 2012 sodelovali na 53 aktivnostih. Poleg tega je bilo še 63 drugih multilateralnih dogodkov. Na področju bilateralnih odnosov je bilo 10 obiskov predstavnikov Državnega zbora v tujini in 16 obiskov tujih delegacij v Sloveniji. Poleg tega pa beležimo še 270 protokolarnih dogodkov v Državnem zboru. Konec leta 2012 je v Državnem zboru delovalo 55 skupin prijateljstva.

Državljeni so na Državni zbor naslovili 176 peticij, Komisija za peticije ter človekove pravice in enake možnosti pa je zaključila 133 zadev.

Kljub številnim nepredvidljivim dogodkom, s katerimi se je Državni zbor srečeval v letu 2012, je opravil obsežno in kvalitetno delo. Hkrati mu je uspelo, da je kljub splošnemu upadu zaupanja javnosti v institucije in politične elite, kar nedvomno zadeva tudi Državni zbor, ohranil precejšnjo mero politične razsodnosti in odigral pomemben delež pri aktualnem razreševanju konflikta interesov v slovenski družbi. To pa je poleg zakonodajne in nadzorne funkcije nedvomno ena najbolj pomembnih funkcij, ki jih imajo sodobni parlamenti.

1 INTRODUCTION AND EXPLANATION OF WORKING METHODS

This annual report on National Assembly's work presents the activities of the deputies at the beginning of the sixth parliamentary term, namely from 21 December 2011 to 31 December 2012 (first year of the parliamentary term). Therefore, the report mainly refers to 2012, and in some parts also to 2011. The report presents:

- the situation at the beginning of the term at the time of the first session of the National Assembly, of the establishment of various parliamentary structures, or at the first occurrence of a certain phenomenon, or
- the situation on 31 December 2011,
- the situation on 31 December 2012,
- the changes occurred in the observed period and statistical data for such period (in most cases separately for 2011 and 2012).

The form and content of this report reflect the already established structure of previous reports with minor changes. The most important change is that in Chapter 11 information on austerity measures at the level of the National Assembly was added.

2 GENERAL INFORMATION

On 4 December 2011, early elections were held for the first time in the history of independent Slovenia, resulting in the new composition of the National Assembly. The first session at which the National Assembly was constituted took place on 21 December 2011. Table 2.1 shows the composition of the National Assembly and the related changes.

Methodological explanation: Deputies are listed in alphabetical order. The number before the name of the deputy refers to the situation on 31 December 2012, meaning that the deputy still holds such office on the said date. The third column indicates membership of deputy group. The fourth column refers to any possible changes.

2.1 Changes in the composition of the National Assembly in the first year of the current parliamentary term

3 SESSIONS OF THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY

3.1 Sessions of the National Assembly

The National Assembly held 34 sessions, of which 9 were regular and 25 extraordinary.

Sessions were open to public, with the exception of two sessions:

- the 4th regular session was partly closed to the public as it discussed the report of the Commission for the Supervision of Intelligence and Security Services for 2011 (item 15 on the agenda of 14 June 2012),
- the 16th extraordinary session was partly closed to the public as it discussed the report of the Bank of Slovenia on the situation in the Slovenian banking system (item 26 on the agenda of 17 July 2012).

The sessions lasted 66 days or 343 hours and 9 minutes in total. The regular sessions lasted 32 days (or 166 hours and 36 minutes), whereas extraordinary sessions lasted 34 days (or 176 hours and 33 minutes).

Altogether, the National Assembly discussed 246 agenda items. It discussed 146 agenda items at regular sessions and 100 agenda items at extraordinary sessions. The floor was taken 5998 times: 3492 times by the deputies and 967 times by the representatives of the Government.

3.2 Adjournments and obstructions

Sessions were adjourned 101-times for various reasons, and the deputy groups announced 30 obstructions, all at regular sessions. The reasons for adjournments of sessions are presented in more detail in Table 3.2. The most frequent reasons for adjournment were adjournments prior to the voting or due to the voting, adjournments at the request of deputy groups, adjournments to obtain an opinion (of working bodies, the Government, of the Legislative and Legal Service) and the adjournments due to "other reasons", mostly secret voting.



2nd regular session, 16 April 2012

PS Deputy Group to items 2b and 2c on the agenda: Draft Act Amending the Personal Income Tax Act and Draft Act Amending the Corporate Income Tax Act (reason: disagreement with the discussion by the urgent procedure).

6th regular session, 26 September 2012 and 3 October 2012

PS Deputy Group and SD Deputy Group to item 3 on the agenda: Draft Slovenia Sovereign Holding Act , PS Deputy Group to item 3a on the agenda the Draft Act on the Measures of the Republic of Slovenia to Strengthen the Stability of the Banks (reason: disagreement with the Government's proposal since the adoption of the law was too rapid which is in conflict with the current legislation, since the ruling coalition rejected the discussion on different models of bank recovery due to the

lack of sufficient expert analyses and bases for decision, since the amendments were tabled too late.)

8th extraordinary session, 14 March 2012

PS Deputy Group (reason: disagreement with the chairing of the session by the Vice-President).

16th extraordinary session, 17 July 2012

PS Deputy Group to all items on the agenda, except items 24 and 26 (in the part of the session closed to the public discussing banking and amendments to the Fiscal Balance Act) and at voting (reason: the rush of the ruling coalition in the adoption of laws).

3.3 Draft and adopted laws and other acts

The tables below indicate all laws and acts adopted by the National Assembly by the end of 2012. Specific categories: national programmes, parliamentary inquiries, referendums and reports are also shown. The tables also indicate the number of proposed and adopted laws per proposer and the number of adopted laws per type of legislative procedure.

In this period 141 laws were adopted. Most of the adopted laws were laws amending other laws (90), followed by laws introducing a new regulation of a specific issue (15). 35 treaties were ratified by law. One Act on notification of succession was also adopted. During this period, the National Assembly adopted 122 other acts.

Finally, certain particularities concerning the reading by regular procedure are also shown: requests for general debate and information on the number of times the second and third reading were held at the same session.

3.3.4. Details concerning the regular legislative procedure

In 2012, 19 laws were adopted by regular legislative procedure, of which 17 were proposed by the Government and 2 by the deputies.

Requests for general debate

According to the Rules of Procedure, a group of at least 10 deputies may request that a general debate be held during the first reading of a draft law by the regular procedure. In 2012, a general debate was held in relation to 8 laws adopted. One was proposed by a group of deputies and the rest by the Government.

The requests for a general debate on laws proposed by the Government were launched by: SD (5x), PS (1x) and SDS (1x). The requests were co-signed by: DL, SLS, NSi and DeSUS (all 1x). For the law which was proposed by the group of deputies with a deputy from SD as the first-signed, a general debate was requested by the same deputy group. Data on the requests for general debate by deputy group are presented in the tables in Chapter 6.

The third reading and voting on the law

If in the second reading amendments are adopted to less than a tenth of the articles of the supplemented draft law, the National Assembly may decide to hold the third reading of the draft law at the same session (Article 138 of the Rules of Procedure). In 2012, 4 or 21.1% of all laws adopted by the regular procedure were adopted in accordance with the above provision.

If no amendment to the supplemented draft law is adopted in the second reading, the National Assembly proceeds to a vote on the law at the same session (Article 139 of the Rules of Procedure). In that year, the deputies adopted 13 laws or 68.4 % of all laws adopted by the regular procedure according to such Article.

The second and third readings were held at the same session in 89.5 % of the cases (17 laws).

3.4 Amendments

In the observed period, a total of 2268 amendments were proposed and 1564 adopted. 2106 amendments were proposed to laws and 1496 of them were adopted. Considering that 141 laws were adopted, on average 14.94 amendments were proposed and 10.61 adopted to each law.

Table 3.9 shows the amendments proposed and adopted to draft laws and other acts per proposer, while table 3.10 shows the amendments in the various stages of the legislative procedure, but only to draft laws.

Referendums

In April 2012, Zoran Petrovič from Polzela filed a motion that voters submit a request to call a **legislative referendum** on the Act Amending the Act on Intervention Step because of Economic Crisis for 2012. The referendum was not called due to insufficient signatures.

In May, the same initiator filed a motion that voters submit a request to call a **legislative referendum** on the Fiscal Balance Act. Since the initiator later withdrew the motion, the procedure of signature collection was suspended.

In July, Viljem Kovačič from Ljubljana filed a motion that voters submit a request to call a **legislative referendum** on the Act Regulating Guarantee of Republic of Slovenia for Liabilites under Long-Term Loan of 440 Million Euros Made to Termoelektrarna Šoštanj, d.o.o. by European Investment Bank for Financing Termoelektrarna Šoštanj 600 MW Replacement Unit-6 Installation Project. The motion was not supported by a sufficient number of signatures, therefore the deadline for the gathering of signatures was not set.

In October, the Trade Union of Energy Workers of Slovenia filed a motion that voters submit a request to call a **legislative referendum** on the Slovenia Sovereign Holding Act. The initiator later withdrew the motion, therefore the deadline for the gathering of signatures was not set.

In October, the Chemical, Non-Metal and Rubber Industries Trade Union of Slovenia filed a motion that voters submit a request to call a **legislative referendum** on the Measures of the Republic of Slovenia to Strengthen the Stability of Banks Act. After subsequent verification, the motion was supported by a sufficient number of eligible voters, therefore the deadline for the collection of signatures was set. However, the collection of signatures was withheld due to the National Assembly's request for the examination of unconstitutional consequences. The Constitutional Court decided on 17 December 2012 that the suspension of the entry into force of the law or its refusal might cause unconstitutional consequences. Therefore, the referendum was not called.

In October, a group of deputies with Jani Möderndorfer as the first signed filed a request to call a **legislative referendum** on the Slovenia Sovereign Holding Act. On the proposal of the National Assembly, the Constitutional Court established on 17 December 2012 that suspension of the entry into force of the law or its refusal might cause unconstitutional consequences, therefore the referendum was not called.

In October, a group of deputies with Jani Möderndorfer as the first signed filed a request to call a **legislative referendum** on the Measures of the Republic of Slovenia to Strengthen the Stability of the Banks Act. Since the request did not fulfil all the legal conditions (only copies of signatures were enclosed), the referendum was not called.

In November, Dušan Harlander from Novo mesto filed a motion that voters call a **legislative referendum** on the Act Amending the Health Services Act. The motion was supported by a sufficient number of signatures, therefore the President of the National Assembly set a deadline for the collection of signatures which expired on 6 February 2013. The referendum was not called due to insufficient number of signatures.

In December, the Trade Union of Professional Fireman of Slovenia filed a motion that voters call a **legislative referendum** on Republic of Slovenia Budget for 2011 and 2012 Implementation Act. The deadline for the collection of signatures was set during which the National Assembly adopted a decision to review the constitutionality of consequences resulting from the suspension of the entry into force of the law or its refusal. Since the initiator withdrew the motion on that same day, the procedure of signature collection was suspended.

Popular initiative

In May, the Association of Theory and Culture of Handicap proposed that voters submit a Draft law on personal assistance. A sufficient number of signatures was collected and the legislative procedure was initiated on 15 June 2012, but the law was not adopted.

In November, the Slovenian Student Union tabled a Draft Scholarship Act which on 31 December 2012 was still subject to legislative procedure.

In 2012, the Artists' Association Pavilion from Komen proposed that voters submit 4 draft laws (the Draft Referendum and Popular Initiative Act, the Draft Act on Basic Living, the Draft Act on Self-Healing and the Draft Act on Cannabis), but which did not receive sufficient support within the set time limit, so the legislative procedure was not initiated.

3.7 Interpellations

Interpellation concerning the work and accountability of the Minister of the Interior Dr. Vinko Gorenak

In the period from 21 December 2011 to 31 December 2012, no request for a **vote of confidence or no confidence** in the Government was submitted. In the first year of parliamentary term 2011-2015, no minister **resigned**, nor was **dismissed** by the National Assembly.

3.8 Immunity of deputies

The Constitution of the Republic of Slovenia provides that no deputy of the National Assembly is criminally liable for any opinion expressed or vote cast at sessions of the National Assembly or its working bodies (professional immunity). Furthermore, it provides that no deputy may be detained nor, where such deputy claims immunity, may criminal proceedings be initiated against him without the permission of the National Assembly, except where such deputy has been apprehended committing a criminal offence for which a prison sentence of over five years is prescribed (non-professional immunity). The National Assembly may also grant immunity to a deputy who has not claimed such immunity or who has been apprehended committing a criminal offence (Article 83 of the Constitution).

The Constitution grants immunity also to judges and Constitutional Court judges. Immunity is also granted to the Ombudsman and Deputy Ombudsmen in accordance with the Ombudsman Act.

In the period from 1 January to 31 December 2012, the Commission for Public Office and Elections discussed 11 issues related to granting immunity to deputies. The National Assembly did not grant immunity and the deputies did not claim such.

In the same period, the National Assembly discussed 2 cases relating to immunity of judges. In one case immunity was granted.

3.10 Motions and proposals by the National Council

Pursuant to the Constitution, the National Council of the Republic of Slovenia (hereinafter referred to as the National Council) may:

- propose to the National Assembly the passing of laws (the legislative initiative);
- convey to the National Assembly its opinion on all matters within the competence of the National Assembly;
- require the National Assembly to decide again on a given law prior to its promulgation (suspensive veto);
- require the calling of a referendum;
- require inquiries on matters of public importance (a parliamentary inquiry).

Where required by the National Assembly, the National Council must express its opinion on an individual matter. It may also submit a proposal to adopt an authentic interpretation of a law. The activities of the National Council concerning the legislative procedure is shown in tables 3.17 and 3.18.

4 THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY AND EU AFFAIRS

In accordance with Article 3a of the Constitution of the Republic of Slovenia, the Act on Cooperation between the National Assembly and the Government regarding EU Affairs, and the provisions of the Rules of Procedure, the National Assembly participates in the formulation of and adopts the positions of the Republic of Slovenia on individual legal proposals that are discussed by EU in those areas which - given their subject matter - would have fallen within the competence of the National Assembly had Slovenia not transferred the exercise of part of its sovereign rights to EU institutions. At the proposal of the Government or at its own initiative the National Assembly may also discuss other EU affairs or examine materials relating thereto. At least once a year, it discusses the state of affairs in the EU and the position of the Republic of Slovenia therein, based on the introductory speech delivered by the President of the Government. The National Assembly also adopts positions on the political orientations regarding the functioning of the Republic of Slovenia within EU institutions in the future. When the National Assembly finds that there has been an infringement of the principle of subsidiarity by an EU legislative act, it forwards to the State Attorney's Office the draft decision supported by a statement of reasons indicating infringements, the order for filing a legal action and orientation instructions for the representation.

The following subchapters present data on the activities of the National Assembly in plenary, the work of the working bodies responsible in relation to EU affairs and the procedures of monitoring compliance with the principle of subsidiarity in the period from 21 December 2011 to 31 December 2012.

4.1 Deciding on EU affairs at plenary sessions of the National Assembly

In the period between 21 December 2011 and 31 December 2012, the National Assembly did not discuss EU affairs at the plenary session.

4.2 Discussion of EU affairs at meetings of working bodies

The data on the number of meetings of the two competent working bodies for EU affairs in the period from 21 December 2011 to the end of 2012, as well as on the number of meetings at which EU affairs were discussed are shown in Table 4.1, while Table 4.2 presents the structure of the discussed affairs. Table 4.3 indicates data on the structure of the discussed affairs at meetings of working bodies responsible in relation to EU affairs. Due to methodological reasons, all tables also include "S" affairs as discussed affairs (see below) of which the working bodies only take note. Joint meetings of two (or more) working bodies are listed separately for each working body. The same applies to the number of EU affairs discussed.

4.2.1 Activities of the working bodies competent for EU affairs

Table 4.1 shows the number of meetings of the two working bodies competent for EU affairs, including the data on the number of meetings at which EU affairs were discussed, whereas Table 4.2 presents the structure of EU affairs discussed at meetings of these two working bodies.

4.3 Monitoring compliance with the principle of subsidiarity

In the period between 21 December 2011 and 31 December 2012, one procedure of control of compliance with the principle of subsidiarity was conducted in relation to the Proposal for a Directive of the European Parliament and of the Council on collective management of copyright and related rights and multi-territorial licensing of rights in musical works for online uses in the internal market COM(2012) 372 final. The Committee on EU Affairs and the Committee on the Economy cooperated in this procedure, however this is not explicitly shown in the above tables.

5 WORKING BODIES AND COMMISSIONS OF INQUIRY

5.1 General information

In the period from 21 December 2011 to 31 December 2012, there were eight commissions and fourteen committees at the National Assembly of the Republic of Slovenia, however, at the end of the year there were only twelve committees since the Joint Committee and the Committee on Domestic Policy, Public Administration and Justice ceased to operate on 27 January 2012. Thus, the total number of working bodies at the end of the term was 20.

The composition of the working bodies reflects the composition of the National Assembly as a whole, with certain deviations in some cases, as for example in the two supervisory bodies and the Commission for National Communities, where deputies of the coalition did not have the majority at the end of 2012. Moreover, certain working bodies have an entirely specific manner of work and cannot possibly be compared with the others.

Considering the total number of seats (281) in all working bodies, individual deputy groups were represented therein on 31 December 2012 as follows:

- PS - 88 seats (31.3%),
- SDS - 82 seats (29.2%),
- SD - 29 seats (10.3%)
- DL - 22 seats (7.8%),
- SLS - 19 seats (6.8%),
- DeSUS - 17 seats (6.0%),
- NSi - 16 seats (5.7%)
- Deputies of the Italian and Hungarian national communities - 8 seats (2.8%)

Unaffiliated deputies were not represented in working bodies as of 31 December 2012.

Diagram 5.1: Number of meetings of working bodies between 21 December 2011 and 31 December 2012




Diagram 5.2: Total duration of meetings of working bodies in the period between 21 December 2011 and 31 December 2012



Diagram 5.3: Number of items on the agenda of meetings of working bodies in the period from 21 December 2011 and 31 December 2012



5.4 Commissions of inquiry

Pursuant to Article 93 of the Constitution and in accordance with the provisions of the Rules of Procedure on Parliamentary Inquiry (Article 1(2) and Article 4 (2) and (3)), the National Assembly orders inquiries into matters of public importance and appoints a commission of inquiry which has powers comparable to those of judicial authorities.

In the period between 21 December 2011 and 31 December 2012 no commission of inquiry was established.

6 DEPUTY GROUPS AND UNAFFILIATED DEPUTIES

The following paragraphs (Tables 6.1 to 6.9) indicate the composition of deputy groups (leaders, deputy leaders and members) and the changes in the composition of deputy groups as well as information on unaffiliated deputies.

Methodological explanation to the tables:

- the first column indicates the office held by individual deputy in the deputy group (leader, deputy leader, or member). The state as of 31 December 2012 is indicated by a number placed before the name of the deputy;



Diagram 6.1: Total number of activities of the deputies by deputy group at regular and extraordinary sessions





11.2 Austerity measures

As in the previous parliamentary term, austerity measures continued to be implemented at the National Assembly also in the current parliamentary term. In 2011 the expenditure in terms of material costs and other expenditures amounted to 77% of the current budget, while in 2012 it equalled 70%. In 2011, the expenditure in the field of investments and maintenance totalled 83% of the current budget, and 79% in 2012. The overall expenditure of the National Assembly's budgetary funds in 2011 amounted to 93% of the current budget, whereas in 2012 it was 91%.

In 2012 the expenditure in terms of material costs and other expenditures was lower for approximately EUR 550,000 compared to expenditure in 2011. This was due to spending cuts, mainly in the areas of office supplies, current maintenance and costs related to official travel.

Economy measures, recorded under the budget heading 3325 *Material costs*, are specified in more detail in Table 11.3 under certain categories of material costs for 2012 compared to the average of 2008-2011.

According to estimates of the leadership, further cuts in material costs are indeed difficult, mostly due to general increase in prices, since in the recent years we have witnessed an increase in the costs of fuel, heating, postal and public utility services.

12 THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY IN THE FIRST YEAR OF THE SIXTH PARLIAMENTARY TERM – AFTERWORD BY THE SECRETARY GENERAL

After the first early elections in the otherwise brief history of independent Slovenian state, held on 4 December 2011, the newly elected National Assembly met at its first session on 21 December 2011. It was expected from the preliminary coalition talks, known from the media, that a candidate from the Social Democrats Deputy Group would be elected President of the National Assembly, yet another candidate was proposed from Positive Slovenia Deputy Group. Since none of the proposals received a majority in two ballots, the candidature of Gregor Virant, the leader of the Civic List Deputy Group, was submitted just before the third ballot, thus suggesting the coalition which elected Gregor Virant as President with 52 votes.

At its first session, the National Assembly also elected two Vice-Presidents: Jakob Presečnik from the Slovenian People's Party Deputy Group and Ljudmila Novak from the New Slovenia Deputy Group. The third position of Vice-President, which pursuant to the Rules of Procedure belongs to the largest opposition deputy group, was conferred to Renata Brunskole from the Positive Slovenia Deputy Group on 2 February 2012.

On the day of formation of the National Assembly and in the following days, all deputy groups were formed – eight altogether: seven on the basis of lists of the political parties which participated in the elections, while one deputy group is always composed of deputies of the Italian and Hungarian national communities.

At the first session of the National Assembly, the Ordinance on the Establishment and Tasks of National Assembly's Working Bodies was adopted, establishing the following bodies: the Committee on EU Affairs, the Committee on Finance and Monetary Policy, the Committee on Domestic Policy, Public Administration and Justice, and the Joint Committee. With the establishment of working bodies the National Assembly was able to start its legislative work and, still in 2011, met at an extraordinary session at which it adopted the Act on Intervention Step because of Economic Crisis.

At the end of January 2012, a new decree was adopted by which the National Assembly fully determined its working bodies and their competences.

In January 2012, the National Assembly witnessed intensive political happenings. At its 2nd session the National Assembly voted on the formateur proposed by the President of the Republic, to lead the formation of the Government. The proposed leader of Positive Slovenia Mr Zoran Jankovič, however, did not gather the necessary majority of votes, and a right-centre coalition was actually formed with the Slovenian Democratic Party at the head. This coalition also appointed its leader Janez Janša as President of the Government at the 5th extraordinary session of the National Assembly held on 28 January 2012. Pursuant to the amended Government of the Republic of Slovenia Act reducing the number of ministries, the National Assembly also appointed the ministers at the beginning of February, whereby the process of the formation of the Government was concluded. The number of ministers was reduced to 12 – among them 11 ministers assumed the management of ministries, whereas the minister without portfolio took over the Office for Slovenians Abroad.

With the election of the third Vice-President (at the beginning of February) and the appointment of the Secretary General (mid-February), the process of establishing the sixth National Assembly was concluded.

A characteristic of the sixth parliamentary term is a relatively high number of new deputies and the highest number of female deputies so far. At its first session, the composition of the sixth parliamentary term comprised as many as 54 new deputies. There were 29 female deputies (32%), the greatest number in all parliamentary terms so far. However, a number of changes in composition were observed, due to government and minister offices of some deputies which are incompatible with the office of a deputy, or pursuant to other reasons. The number of female deputies was even further increased, so by the end of 2012 there were 34 female deputies at the National Assembly, whereas an increase was recorded in the number of re-elected deputies and amounted to 30 deputies.

Due to the economic crisis which also reflected in the Republic of Slovenia, numerous austerity measures were adopted at the National Assembly already in the parliamentary term 2008-2011, all of which largely involved spending cuts in the National Assembly's material costs and investments. Immediately at the beginning of the parliamentary term 2011-2015, further activities related to austerity measures in all areas and not solely in terms of material costs were initiated on the proposal of the President of the National Assembly. Thus, by amending the Deputies Act, the National Assembly reduced the amount of end-of-service allowance and the period of time for which such allowance is granted to deputies whose term of office has expired. Now they are entitled to an allowance in the amount of 80% of their last salary, but for no longer than 6 months after the expiration of their term of office. Such right may be extended for a maximum of 6 months, if during such time a deputy fulfils the conditions for obtaining the old-age pension or if a deputy held the office of a deputy before the expired term of office. A deputy whose term of office has expired before six months have elapsed since the confirmation of his/her election is, however, not entitled to compensation.

By amending internal acts, deputies also reduced the amount granted to deputies for the use of mobile phones and laptops, the amount of funds to cover the material costs related to the performance of their office in the constituency (known as the lump sum), and the amount to cover the costs related to the activities of deputy offices. Reductions were also made in the costs associated with the education of deputies – these funds are strictly allocated for the use of functional education and purchase of text books, expert literature and other audio-video educational materials. Books purchased with the funds intended for deputies' education are recorded as library materials and need to be returned to the National Assembly's library after the expiration of deputy's term of office.

Deputy groups also used less funds allocated for the professional assistance to deputies – the expenditure in 2012 was thus 30% with regard to the funds available.

With the Fiscal Balance Act, also the salaries of deputies witnessed a reduction, together with the separation allowance, meals allowance and the reimbursement of travel costs to and from work. The same also applies to all employees of the National Assembly. The National Assembly's leadership consistently followed the logic of economising in all areas. A restrictive policy was pursued also as regards the payment of overtime and the increased amount of work, there was no employment for the substitution of longer sick leave and retirement, while student work was only exceptionally approved.

In 2012, the National Assembly continued to economise on deputies' official trips abroad. Thus, the expenses of official trips in 2012 were by as much as one-half lower than in 2011 or in the previous years, which was mostly due to austerity measures and the formation of the Assembly in the first months of 2012.

Moreover, entertainment expenses were also reduced in 2012.

Accordingly, in 2012 the National Assembly used the budgetary funds indeed rationally, thereby achieving considerable savings. According to estimates of the leadership, further spending cuts are

indeed difficult, since in the recent years we have witnessed a considerable increase in the prices of some services and goods which is beyond the National Assembly's control.

The first year of the parliamentary term 2011-2015 was characterized by numerous outstanding media reports that supported doubts on personal integrity and suitability of certain deputies performing their offices. Just before the end of 2012, a deputy resigned as she was convicted by final judgement, whereas one deputy announced his resignation and realised it at the beginning of February 2013. Three deputies left their deputy groups and now act as unaffiliated deputies. Such developments triggered discussions on the need of greater personal integrity of elected representatives, causing strong public reactions and a loss of trust in the National Assembly.

Deterioration of economic and social circumstances in the society, fewer public services and announcement of further economising measures, reduction of salaries and staff in the public sector, greater unemployment in the real sector, envisaged measures for the rehabilitation of the banking system, certain adopted provisions in the Act on the establishment of a state assets management company, the subsequent prohibition of the referendum by the Constitutional Court, and the report on the corruption and clientelism in municipalities and at the state level of the Commission for the Prevention of Corruption, all led to a wave of dissatisfaction among the society, causing spontaneous protests already in October, and later in November and December, but which still continue in 2013. The citizens demanded to be actively involved in the formation and adoption of decisions which also led in the demand for the resignation of the current political elite. These events and demands uttered by dissatisfied citizens were also reflected in the work of the National Assembly, even though it was still able to perform a considerable workload.

* * *

In the first year of its sixth parliamentary term the National Assembly:

- held 34 sessions: 9 regular and 25 extraordinary, lasting altogether 66 days or 343 hours and 9 minutes;
- discussed 246 agenda items: 146 at regular sessions and 100 at extraordinary sessions.

Sessions of the National Assembly were open to the public, with the exception of two sessions that were partially closed to the public:

- 15th agenda item at the 4th regular session of 11 June 2012 (discussion of the report on the work of the Commission for the Supervision of Intelligence and Security Services for 2011);
- 26th agenda item at the 16th extraordinary session of 20 July 2012 (discussion of the report of the Bank of Slovenia on the situation in the Slovenian banking system).

Procedural details of the National Assembly's sessions are as follows: 101 adjournments, of which 54 at regular and 47 at extraordinary sessions; 30 obstructions were announced and carried out, of which 4 at regular and 26 at extraordinary sessions.

In this period 141 laws were adopted. Most of the adopted laws were laws amending other laws (90), followed by laws introducing a new regulation of a specific issue (15). 35 treaties were ratified by law. One Act on notification of succession was also adopted. During this period, the National Assembly adopted 122 other acts.

In 2012, 19 laws were adopted by regular legislative procedure, of which 17 were proposed by the Government and 2 by the deputies.

In the observed period, 658 of parliamentary questions and motions were tabled. Deputies received a reply to all questions and motions.

No commission of enquiry was established.

Pursuant to the Referendum and Public Initiative Act, 9 motions or requests to call a legislative referendum were filed, but no referendum was called (in two cases the Constitutional Court established that suspension of entry into force of the law or its refusal might cause unconstitutional consequences, therefore the referendum was not called). However, the referendum on the Family Code was held on the basis of voters' signatures from 2011. There were also 6 initiatives filed proposing that voters submit a draft law. A sufficient number of signatures was collected for two laws and were submitted into the legislative procedure (Draft law on personal assistance was not adopted, while the legislative procedure for the Draft Scholarship Act was not yet concluded at the end of 2012).

In November the National Assembly discussed the interpellation concerning the work and accountability of the Ministry of the Interior Dr Vinko Gorenak, filed by a group of deputies (with Jani Möderndorfer as the first-signed), but rejected it.

The Commission for Public Office and Elections discussed 11 issues relating to the immunity of deputies. The National Assembly did not grant immunity and the deputies did not claim such. In the same period, the National Assembly discussed 2 cases relating to immunity of judges. In one case immunity was granted.

In the analysed period, the National Assembly did not discuss EU matters at its regular sessions. The Committee on EU Affairs and the Committee on Foreign Policy as the competent working bodies discussed EU affairs at 66 meetings (Committee on EU Affairs at 55 and Committee on Foreign Policy at 11 meetings), while the working bodies responsible (committees) discussed such at 78 meetings. A procedure of control of compliance with the subsidiarity principle was also conducted, namely in relation to the Proposal for a Directive of the European Parliament and of the Council on collective management of copyright and related rights and multi-territorial licensing of rights in musical works for online uses in the internal market COM(2012) 372 final.

Since its formation there were 8 commissions and 14 committees at the National Assembly of the Republic of Slovenia; however, at the end of 2012 there were only 12 committees as the Joint Committee and the Committee on Domestic Policy, Public Administration and Justice ceased to operate at the end of January 2011.

The working bodies held 436 meetings, 58% of which were urgent meetings. They lasted 890 hours and 46 minutes. 1141 items on the agenda were discussed at the meetings. They organised 4 public hearings.

The Council of the President of the National Assembly held 38 meetings to discuss issues within its competence. At the beginning of the term and in accordance with the number of deputies in individual deputy groups, the Council also determined to which group belonged the positions of the president and vice-president, and how many positions within working bodies and permanent delegations belonged to an individual deputy group.

The international activity of the National Assembly and its working bodies was fruitful. The National Assembly appointed its delegations to 7 international parliamentary institutions, in which the members of the National Assembly's delegations attended 53 activities in 2012. In addition there were 63 other multilateral events. In the field of bilateral relations there were 10 visits of representatives of the National Assembly abroad and 16 visits of foreign delegations in Slovenia. Moreover, 270 protocol visits took place at the National Assembly. By the end of 2012, 55 parliamentary friendship groups operated at the National Assembly.

176 petitions were addressed to the National Assembly by the citizens and 133 were concluded by the Commission for Petitions, Human Rights and Equal Opportunities,

Despite numerous unforeseeable events encountered by the National Assembly in 2012, it managed to perform and comprehensive and quality workload. Furthermore, in spite of decreased public trust in the institutions and political elites which undoubtedly also affect the National Assembly, it was able to preserve a relatively high degree of political judgement and thus played an important part in the current resolution of conflicts of interests within the Slovenian society. This is, in addition to their legislative and supervisory function, certainly one of the most important functions of modern parliaments.
